

Directions for Round 3 to Chelmsford

Site is on the B1060, from Chelmsford to Roxwell. Take the B1016, from the A12, to Chelmsford. Take A414, to Harlow, second r/bout, turn right towards Writtle. Follow road past Writtle Agricultural College, reaching r/bout on B1060. Turn left, site entrance is opposite Reeds Farm, through the gap in the hedge. You can miss the turn if you are going too quickly!

See over for an important statement from the League Coordinators concerning the role of Team Managers in the BMFA F3J League.

TEAM MANAGER AND LOCAL RULES

At the competition in Walsall one of the teams used a Team Manager to supplement the usual three person group of helpers during the flying process. There are in fact two F3J Competition rules which apply to the position of Managers, as follows:

5.6.1.4 Competitors and Helpers

- (a) The competitor (pilot) must operate his radio equipment personally.
- (b) Each competitor is allowed three helpers. The Team manager is also permitted to assist the competitor. A maximum of two helpers are permitted for towing during the launch as described in 5.6.8.2

and

5.6.12.2 Timekeepers Duties

(b) (local UK rule substitution for FAI rule)

Competitors shall arrange for their flights to be timed by their helpers. Any person timing for a competitor shall be deemed a helper for that competitor. If, for any reason, the CD decides the flight has been mis-timed by the timekeeper, a zero score will be awarded.

Under these rules a Team Manager may assist a pilot, although not help in the launching process or act as a timer (see Rule 5.6.12.2).

It is the Joint League Coordinators belief that while the assistance of a Team Manager is strictly within the rules for F3J as published by the BMFA (effective January 2002), the role of a Team Manager is meant to apply in a European or World Championship context. It would not in our view be in the best interests of the UK national F3J league for an extra person to be introduced in this way during the working time of a pilots' flight during a F3J competition, as this would encourage <u>all</u> teams to introduce a further person to the flying process, and require a considerable increase in the number of people in a team to stay competitive.

Therefore under the CD's right to introduce local rules Nick Evans and Kevin Beale, the F3J League Joint-Coordinators will apply a change to rule **5.6.12.2 Timekeepers Duties** as follows: <u>delete</u>: 'The Team manager is also permitted to assist the competitor', insert: 'The Team manager is also permitted to assist the competitor during the competition, but if not one of the three designated "helpers" will not be allowed in the launching corridor during the working time of a flight.'

This local rule variation will be applied from the next competition.

Kevin looks forward to seeing you all on the 23rd, weather permitting. Nick will be away in France and apologises that he won't be there to enjoy the day.
